## Urgent Imagination: Art and Urban Development

Part I (Multi-site exhibition): September 12 — October 31, 2015

Part 2 (Conference): October 2-3, 2015

Urgent Imagination is a two-part project that proposes creative alternatives to Vancouver's current mode of developerdriven architecture and urban planning.

Urgent Imagination: Part I is a multisite public art exhibition that will take place on the exterior of the Western Front building and surrounding areas throughout September-October 2015. The works, produced by five artists, collectives and architects, respond to the invitation to create artworks and proposals for a multi-acre site in Mount Pleasant that will inevitably be developed, one block from the Western Front. Participating artists include Assemble (London), Nils Norman (London), Other Sights for Artists' Projects (Vancouver), Urban Subjects (Vancouver/Vienna), and Holly Ward (Vancouver).

Urgent Imagination: Part II is a twoday conference that will be held at the Western Front on October 2-3, 2015 that will address these proposals in a broader discursive environment to examine how art and creative thinking can influence issues of urban planning and spatial justice. Free and open to the public, the conference will critically engage issues such as: the limits of terms like "creative class" and "community consultation"; the potential for art to be an agitator or mediator, rather than a contributor to gentrification processes; and issues around scale, scalability, urban density and affordability.
